### “Inside the Safe”

June 2020

The last few months has seen many changes in relation to COVID – 19. As the regulations have begun to become clearer, the latest regulations mean that shooting can return to some sense normality. The Club can now have all members and visitors attend the range without the need for making a booking.

The new regulations allow shooting to occur as long as members remain 1m away from each other (2m<sup>2</sup>). The Committee has organised the shooting calendar to maximise the number of shoots for members. Shooting will now involve Centrefire and Service Rifle to operate on alternate Saturdays starting at 10am for sighting in and competition to begin at 12 noon. Two shooters will now be allowed in each booth.

For the Centrefire shooting, Bisley style shooting will be run. This means that each shooter in a booth will take in all ammunition required (3 sights, 12 rounds to count) and will not leave the booth until finished. Each shooter will fire a single round at a time while the other shooter scores for the one shooting. Each shooter will take turns scoring for the other. This will streamline the process.

Members will be required to mark targets but this will take place with 2 markers on each target. If you have never marked a target before you will be instructed how to do this.

Rimfire shooting will be on an alternate Sunday commencing at 11am. Rimfire will include 22RF, 17HMR and 22 Magnum. The shooting sequence will remain the same as always with 4 details of 10 shoots to score with 3 sighters in the first round. If the members want more rimfire shooting opportunities, then all Sunday's can be scheduled as rimfire.

As always, you must adhere to the 1m spacing, use the hand sanitiser and fill in the attendance book. The club is open to visitors attending.

As a result of the Supreme Court action against the club, the Club's Constitution needs to be amended as the old version was in contravention of the Associations

Incorporations Act. A draft new Constitution will be circulated to all members for comment in the next two weeks. This draft Constitution will be voted on by members at the Club's AGM 28 days after you receive the draft. The AGM will be held at the club rooms in the open range area so as to maintain social distancing. A firm date for the AGM will be circulated to members with an agenda.
